Dr. Kahe is currently the Tilden-Weger-Bieler Professor of Preventive Medicine and Professor of Epidemiology at Columbia University in New York. Earlier, he was an Associate Professor of Nutrition and Epidemiology at University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill, and an Assistant Professor of Preventive Medicine at Northwestern University in Chicago. Dr. Kahe received his medical degree from Soochow University, MS in Nutrition from Tufts University and ScD in Nutritional Epidemiology from Harvard University. Dr. Kahe's research is primarily in nutritional and environmental epidemiology, focusing on lifestyle, dietary and environmental factors in relation to chronic diseases.
